

Welcome back! I hope you've all had an enjoyable Summer Break - I've been looking forward to seeing all of you, and beginning our new journey learning together in Year 6 as part of Ruby Class.

In Creativity this term we will explore the main causes of the First World War and which countries were the major players. Pupils will investigate why so many men volunteered to fight and then sequence the events at the start of the war. Using various sources of evidence, children will learn about life in the trenches and the consequences of new weaponry. They will listen to first-hand accounts of life on the home front and evaluate the impact of war on everyday life. Pupils will also discover the events that led to the Allied Powers' victory and the consequences of the Treaty of Versailles. Your child will also learn about the causes and main events of the Second World War. They will find out how Britain prepared itself for war and the war's impact on civilian life. Also, pupils will learn about the Battle of Britain and how it proved to be a key turning point for the Allied Powers. They will also hear about Anne Frank and discover what her story tells us about the treatment of Jewish people by the Nazi Party. Furthermore, pupils will research the causes and consequences of the end of the Second World War and investigate the legacy of the wars in Britain.

### *Snacks + Water*

Key Stage 2 children can bring in their own fruit from home to eat at break time. Milk can be also purchased via the Cool Milk Scheme.

Please send your child in with a named bottle of **water** each day. No juice or squash please.

### *Classroom Organisation*

Ruby Class will be taught by myself (Mr Downings) with support from our brilliant Teaching Assistants, both in class lessons and during interventions sessions, which will give extra targeted support to pupils. I am in the fortunate position of having already taught the majority of pupils previously last year or in Year 3 + 4, and I am looking forward to continuing to help your child to make progress again this year.

This year, Power Maths will again be taught separately in discrete year groups. Please continue to support your child in developing their mental arithmetic skills at home – particularly their fluency in multiplication and division.

At the end of the day, all children will be dismissed from the main gate.

### *School Uniform*

Please ensure that all clothes are labelled with your child's name, so that it can be identified easily and that appropriate black footwear is worn in school. Due to the autumnal weather, pupils should also wear a coat to school as outdoor learning is an integral part of our Curriculum.

### *PE*

This year, PE sessions for Ruby Class will be on Tuesday and Wednesday, and will take place outside where possible. Children should attend school in their PE kits on these days. Please ensure that they are dressed appropriately for the weather and that their footwear is suitable for physical activity outdoors. Children with long hair must also be able to tie it up for PE, and all earrings must be removed.

### *Reading*

Pupils need to have their reading book and Reading Diary in school every day. We recommend that children read their reading books at home for 15 minutes each day. Please encourage your child to sign or write in their diary after they have read. A member of staff will check their records each week. Their new reading records this also contain a list of the compulsory spelling words from the National Curriculum.

Children will also have a teacher led Guided Reading session each day and will be heard reading regularly in school on group and individual texts.
